Public Awareness & Community Outreach

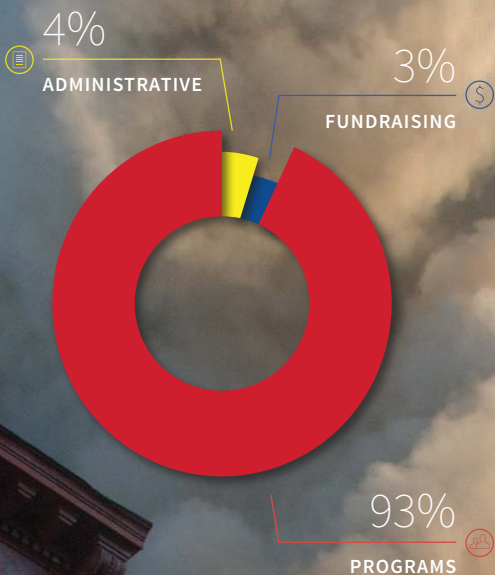
