THE IMPACT

The United States has one of the worst records among industrialized nations – losing on average between four (4) and seven (7) children every day to child abuse and neglect.

Without an opportunity to heal, the cycle of violence and abuse perpetuates exponentially, with no regard for socioeconomic, cultural or religious distinctions, and with a lifetime cost to society close to \$124 billion dollars yearly.

OUR ACTION

HEALING PROGRAMS

Free therapy to victims of child abuse (sexual abuse, physical abuse, domestic violence and neglect) and their families for as long as it takes to heal and thrive.

Free individual therapeutic treatment, not only to the primary victims of abuse, but also to the secondary victims, including siblings and parents, who may themselves be profoundly impacted by traumatic experiences.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Training to medical students and residents from across the country and around the world. Four-to-sixweek residencies on diagnosis and treatment of childhood abuse.

Year-long internship and externship programs for doctoral level psychology students and masters level social work students.

An annual conference, with national trauma experts. Include nearly 2,000 trained mental health and multi-disciplinary professionals in the treatment of abuse.

CHILD RIGHTS PROGRAMS

Child abuse awareness and prevention programs to schools and communities nationwide - educating teachers, childcare workers, lawyers, nurses, judges, police officers and other first responders on child abuse recognition and response.

Parenting workshops providing insight on family dynamics and discipline practices.

Dedicated to Children's rights for over 20 years, the New York Center for Children (NYCC) is the only treatment center in New York City to provide free, comprehensive therapy services to child victims of physical and sexual abuse and their families, for as long as their healing requires.
