

PROMOTING LITHIUM-ION **BATTERY SAFETY**



Fires caused by lithium-ion batteries have increased dramatically in New York City with deadly consequences. These rechargeable batteries are found in electric bikes and scooters, cars, laptops, tablets, phones and common household devices. Lithium-ion battery fires have caused deaths, serious injuries and devastating damage to property around the city.

In addition to public outreach and training initiatives aimed at addressing lithium-ion battery fires, the FDNY Foundation has teamed up with food delivery companies to teach and educate New York e-bike drivers about the dangers of knock-off lithium-ion batteries.

We thank Uber Eats, Grubhub, and DoorDash for their generous support which will help increase fire safety messaging, education and outreach in NYC, saving lives and protecting property.

The FDNY Foundation and Kiddie donated 4,500 smoke detectors through the "Cause For Alarm" campaign. The alarms were distributed to eight departments located in Pennsylvania, Connecticut, New Jersey, and New York. These departments help give out and install the alarms throughout their communities, and serve low income, elderly, and at-risk populations.

Virtual Reality to Promote Fire Safety

The FDNY Foundation welcomed FEMA's Ready Campaign, the U.S. Fire Administration, META, and the Ad Council, to the FDNY FireZone in New York City to launch a new virtual reality experience that promotes fire awareness. The Escape Plan is a Fire Safety XR experience for VR, Mobile and Desktop. It lets users safely practice their escape skills on their own time so they can prepare for future fire hazards.

The future of emergency rescue medicine was on full display at the FDNY Search & Rescue Field Medicine Symposium (SRFM). The annual event is the conference that military, federal, state and local medical responders attend to share their experiences, best practices and innovative ideas.

New this year, attendees were immersed in a special live, wide-area disaster scenario using drones to find patients, use aerial triage methods and collect important information that will allow for safe, efficient, and prompt medical care and transport. The FDNY Foundation is committed to ensuring the FDNY has access to cutting-edge tools, resources and procedures to aid the members of the Department in their lifesaving mission and is innovating search and rescue operations for the fire service worldwide.



Enhancing Preparedness



CPR TRAINING LEADS TO SECOND CHANCES



In celebration of National EMS Week 2023, the FDNY held its annual Second Chance Ceremony. This special event reunited 10 patients who survived cardiac arrest with the Paramedics, Emergency Medical Technicians, FDNY EMS Officers, Firefighters, Dispatchers, bystanders, and other first responders who helped save their lives.

Several of this year's survivors received cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) from bystanders before on-duty FDNY members arrived. Immediate CPR, coupled with defibrillation within the first few minutes after sudden cardiac arrest, can greatly increase a victim's chance of survival. Wednesday, May 24 Liberty Warehouse, Brooklyn

CPR SAVES LIVES

The FDNY CPR Training Unit, which is made possible thanks to the FDNY Foundation, offers free compressions- only CPR training throughout the city and has trained more than 200,000 New Yorkers to perform bystander CPR, including more than 80,000 high school students.


FDNY K-9 Unit Enhances Canine Wellness

In June, the FDNY Fire Academy hosted a K-9 medical first aid course for handlers from the United States Police Canine Association Region 7. Representatives from 70 state, federal, and local agencies were in attendance, including FDNY Fire Marshals and their K-9s, to learn how to make sure their K-9s stay in good shape and how to handle medical emergencies should they become sick or injured.

"We are the first line of defense of protection for our dogs so learning how to diagnose serious issues and save your dog's life in the event of heat stroke, or some kind of impalement or shooting is really important," said Fire Marshal Chris Cuccaro. "They demonstrated the canine fitness program, which is important because our K-9s are athletes. And it also extends the career of the dog and extends the health of the dog and the life expectancy."

This multi-agency event was made possible thanks to support from the FDNY Foundation.







STAIRCLIMB TO SUMMIT

Beyond preparing for the difficult tasks FDNY members perform every single day, our Foundation strives to ensure their long-term health and readiness.

Late April, the FDNY Foundation hosted the First Annual FDNY Foundation Climb To SUMMIT with support from SL Green Realty Corp. at the iconic One Vanderbilt in New York City. The climb was a tremendous success! More than 300 climbers from firehouses, EMS stations, corporations and individuals participated to help raise funds for FDNY members' health, fitness and wellness. The 20 fastest teams of Firefighters and EMTs won stair climbers for their firehouses and EMS station from funds raised.

These students have successfully completed a challenging academic program that focuses on leadership and strength as core values, as well as the academic and physical skills necessary for emergency responders.

FDNY Officers Management Institute

On June 27, 2023, the FDNY Officers Management Institute (FOMI), graduated 16 FDNY members at a ceremony in Brooklyn. Developed by Columbia University and funded by the FDNY Foundation, FOMI helps make the FDNY more resilient and stronger by giving high-ranking members a solid foundation in management principles and leadership strategies which are essential to the Department's continued operational success.

Since its inception, the FDNY Foundation has invested over \$5 million in FOMI, which was developed based on a recommendation in the McKinsey Report done in the wake of September 11, 2001.


PROBY PAVILION DEDICATED IN MEMORY OF THOSE LOST



On Thursday, June 1st, the FDNY Foundation joined the FDNY at the FDNY Fire Academy for a Proby Pavilion Dedication.

Funded by the FDNY Foundation, the Proby Pavilion was dedicated to the memory of the FDNY Pobationary Firefighters who were killed in the line of duty while assigned to the Fire Academy. It is a memorial that was constructed by Firefighters remembering eight Firefighters, six of whom were killed on 9/11/01. Those members are Richard D. Allen, Calixto Anaya Jr., Michael D. D'Auria, Andrew C. Brunn, Michael F. Cammarata and Anthony Rodriguez. Jamel Sears died while at training in November 2008, and Vincent Malveaux died doing the same in December 2021.

The FDNY Foundation joins the FDNY in honoring and remembering the eight FDNY Probationary Firefighters who were killed in the line of duty while assigned to the Fire Academy. They will never be forgotten.
